Legislative leaders have prevented progress on expansion for years. In fact, the last time a House committee allowed a hearing on expansion was 2017. It's time for the overwhelming majority of Kansans who support expansion to have their voices heard in the Statehouse. The benefits of KanCare expansion are clear:



Reduce health care costs for everyone. When uninsured Kansans can't get health coverage, that means more in uncompensated care costs. This means everyone pays more.



Protect against medical debt. By expanding KanCare, tens of thousands of Kansans will be able to afford insurance coverage.



Fix eligibility limits, which are too low. In 2023, a single parent with two children couldn't make more than about \$9,500 per year to qualify for KanCare. Expansion would allow that parent to work more hours or get a better paying job without losing health coverage.



Preserves & strengthens rural health care. Kansas has more rural hospitals at risk of closing than any other state our size. Expansion ensures rural Kansans can get the care they need while giving a boost to their economies.



Helps address general workforce shortages. When people have access to the physical and behavioral health care they need, there are more workers healthy enough to re-enter or remain in the workforce.



Makes Kansas more economically competitive. Expanding KanCare helps our state compete with our neighbors who have already expanded their Medicaid programs.
