

HELP EXPAND KANCARE

Low-wage working Kansans are falling through the cracks when it comes to access to health care. This causes real harm to the individual, their family and the physicians and other providers who care for them. Fortunately, there is a solution to this problem: KanCare expansion. Expansion would extend eligibility for KanCare to adults earning up to 138% of the federal poverty level and the majority of the cost would be paid by the federal government. Expansion would close the coverage gap and provide coverage to an estimated 150,000 Kansans.

The Alliance for a Healthy Kansas is recruiting signatures for an open letter to policymakers in support of KanCare expansion. The letter came about in response to the desire of several physician members of the Alliance network to use their unique voice to help break the logjam on KanCare policy progress.

We will present the open letter to the Legislature during the last week of April.
