There are three data sets included in the County Fact Sheets. The respective sources and formulas, where applicable, are as follows:

1. Number of county's uninsured residents who would become eligible for Medicaid with expansion.

Number of Kansans 18-64 years earning under 138 percent of the federal poverty level as reported in the Census Bureau Small Area Health Insurance Estimates (SAHIE)

2. Amount of new annual health care spending in the county.

Number of Kansans 18-64 years earning under 138 percent of the federal poverty level as reported in the Census Bureau Small Area Health Insurance Estimates (SAHIE) in the county multiplied by \$9,000

3. Number of new jobs created in the county.

Number of Kansans 18-64 years earning under 138 percent of the federal poverty level as reported in the Census Bureau Small Area Health Insurance Estimates (SAHIE) by county multiplied by the estimated total number of jobs created in the state as determined by the Commonwealth Fund (22,900 according to "The Economic and Employment Effects of Medicaid Expansion Under the American Rescue Plan," May 20, 2021) divided by the total of number of uninsured in the coverage gap in Kansas.
